Judge Nosworthy's journey into the field of International Criminal Law as a member of the Judiciary began in November 2005 when she joined the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia.

She has written and lectured on legal topics relating primarily to criminal law and was a contributor of a number of articles published in the Gleaner and Observer between 1981 and 2005 on issues such as Family, Women, Children/Child Abuse, the Death Penalty and among other areas. She has also participated in the Global Leadership of Women (GLOW) project as an International Judge in the Judicial Training of Judges of West Africa and South East Asia and is presently a member of the International Association of Women Judges.

Judge Nosworthy was called to the Bar of Gray's Inn in 1972 and was admitted to practice in Jamaica and Antigua in 1973 and 1978 respectively.
